Ensemble Application

Program description

The Blackbird Creative Lab is a two-week creative immersion hosted by Grammy-award winning ensemble Eighth Blackbird. The 2024 Lab will invite chamber ensembles and composers to join us at Yerkes Observatory in Williams Bay, Wisconsin from May 28th - June 11th, 2024.

Created for artists / by artists, the Lab encourages, challenges, and supports participating musicians as they explore their artistic vision and expand their artistic practice as they create new work and hone their practical know-how in an exploratory, collaborative, and boundary-pushing environment.

Moving beyond the model of a brief one-time experience, the Lab aims to foster an ongoing community and share the commitment to mentorship amongst all of its participants. To carry out the Lab's vision, Eighth Blackbird draws upon their ever-growing network of collaborators, mentors, and mentees across disciplines and experiences.

Invited composers will be asked to compose a 7-10 minute new work for one of the selected Lab ensembles. For a timeline of the commission project, see <u>Lab 24' Commission Timeline</u>.

Program and application fees

The application fee is \$25 for composers. Please reach out if you are in need of financial assistance or are in need of application accommodations.

The Lab offers a need-based sliding scale tuition from \$250 to \$2,500 per participant. In 2023, the majority of participants paid \$500 or less to attend the Lab. We encourage applicants to apply regardless of ability to pay. We will request information from finalists seeking financial aid around January 20th.

Eligibility/Evaluation Criteria

Applications will be evaluated based on:

openness to collaboration, risk-taking, experimentation

- artistic dedication and voice
- insatiable curiosity and vision
- capacity to communicate effectively, with a focus on clarity
- technical prowess

Composers must be 21+ years old by May 28th, 2024.

Share about your decision to apply to the Lab and how you envision this experience may impact you as a composer. What are your short-term (1-3 year) and long-term (3-5 year) professional goals, and how do you envision your two weeks at The Lab helping you achieve those goals? Think both practically and creatively. (250 word max or 1 minute max)

Eighth Blackbird has spent much of their career collaborating across disciplines (movers, visual artists, theater performers, etc). What is your interest in multidisciplinary work, and your approach to collaborating with artists outside your own discipline? (250 word max or 1 minute max)

Describe a dream project! Give us a sense of your imagination. (250 word max or 1 minute max)
